# What is Dual Enrollment?

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Dual Enrollment is when a student is awarded both high school and college credit- by taking college classes instead of high school classes.

Must be a junior or senior.

Must have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.00 or higher and maintain this GPA throughout high school.

Must have approval from parent/guardian and school Academic Advisor.

Must have a good attendance record and be in good disciplinary standing.

Must earn qualifying test scores.

# Eligibility Criteria for Dual Enrollment

# What is Early Admissions?

Early Admissions students take 12 to 14 credit hours each term at FSCJ. Because the student is still in high school, those credits earn both high school and college credit.

# Criteria for Early Admissions

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Can begin fall of Senior year.

Must have a 3.5 cumulative unweighted GPA and maintain that throughout their senior year

Must have approval from parent/guardian and counselor

Must have a good attendance record and be in good disciplinary standing.



**Earn high school and college credit simultaneously.**

## Disadvantages

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Students who earn less than a 3.00 college GPA may weaken their appeal to college admissions counselors.

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Students who earn less than a 2.00 college GPA will **not** be granted admission to selective state universities: FSU, UF, UCF, etc.

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Students with less than a college cumulative GPA of 2.00 become ineligible to continue in the program.

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Parents do not see grades until the end of the semester.

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Parents cannot get involved in issues with their student's professors.

# Poor Performance

Students taking dual enrollment classes are creating a permanent college transcript that will impact future educational opportunities such as admission to limited access programs, scholarships and eligibility for financial aid.

Consequently, students who earn more than a single grade of D, are placed on probation and are only able to retake the class in which they received the D the next semester.

Students who make more than one D or an F in a semester will not be allowed to continue in the program.

## Is Dual Enrollment a good fit?

Decide if dual enrollment is a good fit for you, your son, or daughter.

- Have they demonstrated self- motivation?
- Are they mature, responsible, and accountable?
- Have they had attendance issues in the past?
- Are they prepared for a secular learning environment?
- Are they self-motivated
- Are they able to take initiative and speak with professors regarding their grades and attendance?
- Do they demonstrate “individual responsibility”
- Are they organized? Every professor has a unique attendance and grading policy. Professors do not remind students when assignments are due. Students are given an assignment sheet or syllabus and are responsible for completing the assignments on time

# Next Steps

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1. Fill out the online application. Carefully follow the step-by-step directions. Double check that everything is entered correctly, especially your **name, date of birth, social security number, and email address!**
2. Once your application is approved and you are assigned an EMPL ID number, you can fill out the Referral Form for Online Assessment or schedule to take the PERT, SAT ([www.sat.org](http://www.sat.org)), or ACT ([www.act.org](http://www.act.org)). Students must have a Referral Form to take the PERT.
3. When you have earned qualifying scores on the test of your choice, email or bring a paper copy to Mrs. Hall ([nhall@evajax.com](mailto:nhall@evajax.com)).
4. Choose classes at [www.fscj.edu](http://www.fscj.edu), check professors at [www.ratemyprofessors.com](http://www.ratemyprofessors.com), and fill out course request form.
5. Turn in course request form to Mrs. Hall.

# Qualifying Test Scores

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## PERT (Postsecondary Education Readiness Test) Minimum Scores

- Writing 103-150
- Reading 106-150
- Math (MAT1033, MGF1106, MGF1107 ) 114-122 for
- Math (MAC1105) 123-150

\*the PERT is free the 1<sup>st</sup> time, additional attempts cost \$32.00.

## Accuplacer

- English 245 or higher
- Reading 245 or higher
- Math (MAT1033, MGF1106, MGF1107) 242-259
- Math (MAC1105) 260-300

\*Accuplacer is free the 1<sup>st</sup> time, additional attempts cost \$32.00.

## Qualifying Test Scores

Students need to have test scores by the end of March/beginning of April.

Students who do NOT qualify for Intermediate Algebra (MAT1033) or higher are limited to a **maximum of 12 credit hours of Dual Enrollment.**

This would limit them to two classes each semester of their first year of dual enrollment. After that, they would no longer be allowed to dual enroll until they earned a qualifying math score.

They may not participate in Summer Term unless they have qualified in Math.

# Course Load for Juniors and Seniors who participate in Dual Enrollment

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## Juniors

Maximum of 11 credit hours per term (most take 6 to 9 hours)

Minimum of 5 classes at EVA (1 can be a college class) each semester

Must earn at least 7 graduation credits for the year

## Seniors

Maximum of 11 credit hours per term

Bible class and possibly other classes at EVA

Must take and pass at least 5 classes each semester



# Course Load for Early Admissions

12-14 credit hours through FSCJ

One Bible credit at EVA

Possible additional credits at EVA

- Math
- Additional foreign language credits
- Elective Class

## Choosing Courses

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Understand that not every course offered at FSCJ will be applicable towards your bachelor's degree.

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Exception: If you earn the AA degree and attend a college in the Florida State University System. (UNF, FSU, UF, UCF, etc.) they will accept all your credits, but they may not all apply toward your major.

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Private colleges may not apply all of your credits towards their general education courses.

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Talk with the colleges now so you know which courses will be accepted.

# Online Courses

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All courses will appear in your MyFSCJ account.

Online courses are managed through Canvas.

Students must log into their class on the first day or they will likely be dropped from the class.

It is the student's responsibility to manage their assignments, quizzes, and tests. You will be dropped for inactivity.

Online classes typically require more work and may be graded tougher.

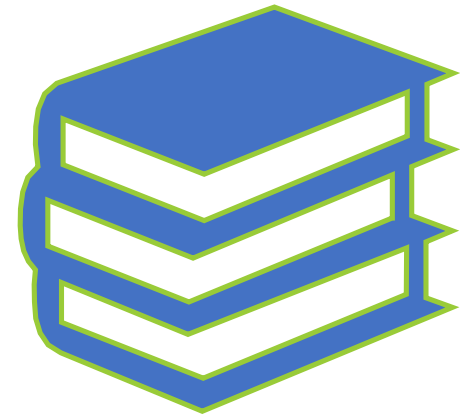
Online professors show little mercy.

Online professors may not respond quickly to emails.

Students cannot wait until the last minute.

Online students must be motivated and capable of self-teaching.



# Summer Term

EVA offers SLS1103 (a required course) during the summer. The cost is \$216 plus the cost of the book. This is usually a hybrid course.

When there is availability, students may also take summer courses at Trinity Christian Academy.

# Policies and Procedures

You may take classes at any campus which works with your schedule. Juniors must select classes that start after 12:35. Seniors must select classes after 9:45 if they are taking 2 classes at EVA, after 10:40 if they are taking 3 classes at EVA. Factor in driving time from the EVA campus.

Students should avoid online classes if at all possible.

Avoid withdrawing from classes if at all possible.

You **CANNOT** register, drop, or add classes online.


Once you have selected classes that work with your schedule, check the reviews for the professor at [www.ratemyprofessors.com](http://www.ratemyprofessors.com).

Once you have completed the Course Request Form it must be turned in to Mrs. Hall and she will complete the registration process.


# Student Responsibilities

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Report any course difficulties to Mrs. Hall as they occur. Do not wait until you are failing the course.



Seek guidance approval before deciding to withdraw from a class. Withdrawal will be processed by Mrs. Hall and the FSCJ coordinator.



\*\*Withdrawing from a dual enrollment course may result in disqualification from the dual enrollment program and repayment of benefit to EVA.



\*\* Withdrawing from a course during the senior year may result in summer school at EVA. Seniors must take and pass 5 courses each semester of their senior year.

# Parking pass, ID card, college student resources

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Parking passes may be obtained on campus at no charge.



All students must obtain an FSCJ photo ID to be allowed on an FSCJ campus. If a student is under 18, they must have a parent/guardian signature on the form needed to obtain an ID.



Dual enrollment students may participate in student clubs, events, and organizations. In adherence to NCAA regulations, high school students may not participate on collegiate athletic teams.



Dual enrollment students are college students and subject to the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. In brief, this means that student records are not released to anyone, even parents, without written permission from the student. Professors will interact with students regarding their performance, and not with parents or other outside individuals.

# Cost

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For Dual Enrollment Students, tuition covers the cost of 6 credit hours per semester. Students who choose to take a third DE class are responsible for the cost (\$71.98 per credit hour).

For Early Admission Students, tuition covers the cost of 12 credit hours per semester. Additional credit hours are the responsibility of the student.

Students are responsible for the cost of books and materials.
